

Acute or Obtuse Angles?


Write your answer on the red line


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
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
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
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
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




ANGLE COLOUR!





Types of Angles Worksheet


Look at these different angles:




ARCHITECT

An architect is a person who designs buildings and prepares plans to give to a builder. Architects decide the size, shape, and what the building will be made from.

Here is an example of an architect sketch. They usually start off by sketching in pencil and once they are happy with it, they will go over their drawing with black, fine line pen - using a ruler, colouring in and marking garden areas, flowers, trees, paths etc.

Angles are a measure of turn and are measured in degrees. An **angle** is a way of describing the space between 2 lines that begin at the same point. An **angle** is a measure of how much you have to turn one of the lines so that it perfectly overlaps with the other. An **angle** is measured in degrees ($^{\circ}$) using a protractor. **Angles** can be measured anywhere from 0° to 360°
